UNFPA hereby solicits a quotation for the following service:

Conducting Operational Research on a Sexuality and Life Skills Education Pilot Project.

UNFPA requires the provision of furnishing policymakers with evidence-based technical support for the development and implementation of sexuality education and life skills in China (informed by content of the 'International Comprehensive CSE Guidelines' and national policy guidance)

Purpose of consultancy:	I. Background Sexuality Education and Life Skills is a fundamental component of holistic education, ensuring young people's well-being, safety, and informed decision-making of their bodies and lives. In China, there has been an increasing commitment to the provision of age-appropriate, nationally-contextualised sexuality education. Providing sex education to adolescents and youth (A&Y) has been addressed in national laws and policies. For example, Article 40 of the Law of the People's Republic of China on the
	Protection of Minors (revised in 2020), which was enacted on June 1, 2021, states: "Schools and kindergartens shall provide age-appropriate sexuality education to



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minors." Article 42 of the Regulations on the Protection of Minors in Schools issued by the Ministry of Education effective on September 1, 2021, states that "puberty education and sexuality education should be carried out in a targeted manner so that students can increase their knowledge of physiological health and improve their self-protection awareness and ability to prevent sexual abuse and sexual harassment."

Efforts are needed to enforce the Law, especially in rural and less developed areas. Research shows that in China, most young people have never taken sexuality courses in their schools. It has never been set up as a stand-alone course but relies on carrier subjects such as physical education and health, and is integrated into other subjects such as science, biology, ethics and wellness.

UNFPA is the UN's sexual and reproductive health (SRH) agency. UNFPA works with partners all over the world to create a world where every pregnancy is wanted, every childbirth is safe, and every young person's potential is fulfilled. UNFPA's vision is to end preventable maternal deaths, unmet family planning needs, and gender-based violence by 2030, thereby contributing to the achievement of the SDGs.

Supporting the development of quality sexuality and life skills education is one component of the 9th Cycle of UNFPA/China programme between 2021-2025. In 2024-2025, UNFPA wishes to contract a local institution to deliver a piece of operational research at sub national level that will implement and assess the roll out of a sexuality education/life skills project with middle school students. The project will include the delivery of a Training of Trainers (TOT) to local teachers, research to collect evidence-based results for experience sharing and the documentation of the effectiveness of the pilot intervention to be used for advocacy and learning.

- II. **Objectives:** To furnish policymakers with evidence-based technical support for the development and implementation of sexuality education and life skills in China (informed by content of the 'International Comprehensive CSE Guidelines' and national policy guidance)
- III. **Expected Project outcome**: Improve young people's sexual and reproductive health and knowledge in the local setting and generate evidence-based results for policy advocacy regarding implementation of age-appropriate sexuality education and life skills in the context of China.

Objectives and Scope of the Services

Background information

Sexuality Education is a fundamental component of holistic education, ensuring young people's well-being, safety, and informed decision-making of their bodies and lives. In China, in recent years, there have been breakthroughs in promoting sexuality education. Providing sexuality education to A&Y has been addressed in the Law and specific policies. For example, Article 40 of the Law of the People's Republic of China on the Protection of Minors (revised in 2020), which was enacted on June 1, 2021, states, "Schools and kindergartens shall provide age-appropriate sexuality education to minors." Article 42 of the Regulations on the Protection of Minors in Schools issued by the MOE which came into effect on September 1, 2021, states that "puberty education and sexuality education should be carried out in a targeted manner so that students can understand the physiological health knowledge and improve their self-protection awareness and ability to prevent sexual abuse and sexual harassment."

However, there remain gaps in policy enforcement reaching local levels, particularly in rural and less developed areas. Research shows that in China, most young people have never taken sexuality education courses in their schools. It has never been set up as a stand-alone course but relies on carrier subjects such as physical education and health, and is integrated into national subjects such as science, biology, morality and rule of law, and ideology and politics.

In 2024-2025, UNFPA is planning to formulate a sexuality education and life skills project at a sub national level in collaboration with local partners, to deliver sexuality education to middle school students in targeted middle schools, provide TOT to local teachers, and conduct research to collect evidence-based results for good practices sharing and lessons learning.

Development objective(s)



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The project aims to combine China's recent policy achievements in sexuality education with practical onthe-ground practices advocated by UNFPA. Its goal is to furnish policymakers with evidence-based technical support for the development and implementation of sexuality education in China.

- Immediate objective(s)
- 1. Enhanced capacity of teachers in targeted schools in conducting sexuality education and life skills courses
- 2. Enhanced life skills of students in targeted schools
 - Outputs / Deliverable(s)

Improve young people's SRH in rural areas and generate evidence-based results for policy advocacy of implementation of sexuality education across China.

Activities

Output 1: Provide tailored sexuality education and life skills to students, with a focus on the marginalized groups and gender equality

- Develop culturally sensitive, age-appropriate CSE curriculum materials, drawing upon the International Technical Guidance on Sexuality Education (ITGSE) and the CSE Technical Guideline in China.
- Deliver interactive, age-appropriate sexuality education and life skills curriculum to students at the pilot schools
- Integrasexuality education and life skills courses into the school curriculum system, ensuring dedicated course hours and human resources.

Output 2: Conduct TOT to empower local teachers to build capacity on leading sexuality education

 Provide TOT for teachers at targeted schools, offering reasonable incentives to enhance the sustainable capacity of local educators

Output 3: Collect evidence-based results through a research for potential practice sharing

- Conduct pre- and post-assessment to measure and study the improvement in recipients' attitudes, knowledge and skills related to sexual and reproductive health.

III. Eligible Bidders

This Request for Quotation is open to all eligible bidders; to be considered an eligible bidder for this solicitation process you must comply with the following:

- A bidder must be a legally-constituted company/institution that can provide the requested services and have legal capacity to enter into a contract with UNFPA to deliver in the country, or through an authorized representative.
- A bidder must not have a conflict of interest regarding the solicitation process or with the TORs / Technical Specifications. Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified.
- At the time of Bid submission, the bidder, including any JV/Consortium members, is not under procurement prohibitions derived from the <u>Compendium of United Nations Security Council</u> <u>Sanctions Lists</u> and has not been suspended, debarred, sanctioned or otherwise identified as ineligible by any <u>UN Organization</u> or the <u>World Bank Group</u>.

Both parts of the quotation must be signed by the bidding company's relevant authority and submitted in PDF format.

VI. Overview of Evaluation Process

The evaluation will be carried out in a two-step process by an ad-hoc evaluation panel. Technical proposals will be evaluated and scored first, prior to the evaluation and scoring of price quotations

Technical Evaluation

Technical proposals will be evaluated based on their responsiveness to the service requirements /TORs listed in Section II and in accordance with the evaluation criteria below.

Financial Evaluation

Price quotes will be evaluated only for bidders whose technical proposals achieve a minimum score of 70 points in the technical evaluation.

Price quotes will be evaluated based on their responsiveness to the price quote form. The maximum number of points for the price quote is 100, which will be allocated to the lowest total price provided in the quotation. All other price quotes will receive points in inverse proportion according to the following formula:

The total score for each proposal will be the weighted sum of the technical score and the financial score. The maximum total score is 100 points.

Total score = 70% Technical score + 30% Financial score

VII. Award Criteria

In case of a satisfactory result from the evaluation process, UNFPA intends to award a Professional Service Contract to the Bidder(s) that obtain the highest total score.

VIII. Right to Vary Requirements at Time of Award

UNFPA reserves the right at the time of award of contract to increase or decrease by up to 20% the volume of services specified in this RFQ without any change in unit prices or other terms and conditions.

IX. Payment Terms

UNFPA payment terms are net 30 days upon receipt of invoice and delivery/acceptance of the milestone deliverables linked to payment as specified in the contract.

X. Fraud and Corruption

UNFPA is committed to preventing, identifying, and addressing all acts of fraud against UNFPA, as well as against third parties involved in UNFPA activities.
