Purpose of consultancy:	The purpose of the consultancy is to provide an online Training for Trainers (TOT) workshop using the Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) Technical GuidelineAdaptation of Global Standards for Potential Use in China (First Edition) (hereafter referred to as the Guideline)
Scope of work: (Description of services, activities, or outputs)	Background: UNFPA is the United Nations sexual and reproductive health agency. UNFPA works with governments, civil society organizations (CSOs), academia, the private sector, and young people to improve adolescents' sexual and reproductive health (ASRH), including life-skills-based sexuality education. UNFPA also promotes policies for, and investment in, sexuality education programmes that meet internationally agreed-upon standards.
	To support China's effective implementation of sexuality education programmes adapting the Chinese context and the latest scientific evidence, UNFPA and UNESCO supported the development of the China CSE Technical GuidelineAdaptation of Global Standards for Potential Use in China (First Edition) in 2018-2022. The development of the Guideline was led by Professor Liu Wenli of the sexuality education project team of Beijing Normal University, through engaging with a technical advisory group consisting of relevant specialists and resource persons from diverse backgrounds. The process included an extensive literature review and technical consultations, with the International Technical Guidance on Sexuality Education (ITGSE) being used as the main reference. The Guideline also took reference to updated national laws, policies, and guidance related to sexuality education, health education, and child development.
	The Guideline is designed as a reference source for policymakers, CSE practitioners, programme managers, professional associations, education institutions, CSOs, youth groups and young people, and the public in designing, implementing, and monitoring scientific, gender-responsible, culturally sensitive, and age-appropriate sexuality education for children and young people of all ages both in China and through knowledge exchange in South-South Cooperation.
	Therefore, to introduce the key concepts of the Guideline to CSE practitioners such as programme managers and CSE trainers, to equip them with skills to provide CSE to young people, and to align their work with the Guideline in a standardized way, a TOT workshop is necessary to be provided. Respecting the COVID pandemic prevention measures in China, the workshop will be held online.
	 Scope of work: To design and provide a 4-day online TOT workshop on CSE for 25-30 selected participants (e.g.CSE trainers or programme managers) using the Guideline. Specifically, the national consultant will be performing the following tasks: Develop a ToT workshop outline with clear objectives, content that covers all key concepts in the Guideline, proposed methods, agenda, and learning materials (PPTs, videos, group or individual exercises, etc) using the Guideline Call for applications and lead the selection of participants who are affiliated with institutions and organizations conducting CSE programmes/initiatives and interested in using the Guideline for long-term teaching activities. The list of participants with brief information about them will be shared and agreed upon by UNFPA Conduct the TOT workshop for 25-30 participants effectively using participatory methods. It also includes the facilitation and organization of the workshop Design and conduct pre-and-post surveys to assess effectiveness of the
