TERMS OF REFERENCE (to be completed by Hiring Office) UNFPA China Office, Beijing Hiring Office: Purpose of consultancy: UNFPA is the United Nations sexual and reproductive health agency. It works in more than 150 countries including China, to ensure every pregnancy is wanted, every childbirth is safe, and every young person's potential is fulfilled. UNFPA issued a Disability Inclusion Strategy - We matter, we belong, we decide in 2021, to put persons with disabilities at the very centre of everything UNFPA does. Disability inclusion means making the work of UNFPA stronger by ensuring sexual and reproductive health and rights for all. Focusing on the rights of persons with disabilities supports the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals, especially the principle of "leaving no one behind" and "reaching the furthest behind", and contributes to the implementation of the the United Nations Partnership on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNPRPD) joint project, where UNFPA is a member of 2024 marks the 30th anniversary of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD). Held in Cairo in 1994, the ICPD highlighted the need to place individual's rights and choices at the centre of development. The ICPD Programme of Action (POA), adopted by 179 governments, called on states to address the sexual and reproductive health needs of persons with disabilities, and it demanded the elimination of discrimination that undermines the reproductive rights of persons with disabilities. As the custodian of the ICPD, UNFPA is leading the global commemoration of its 30th anniversary in 2024. In China, UNFPA will be working closely with national partners, including women, youths and organizations of persons with disabilities, to raise awareness about the importance of promoting the rights of persons with disabilities, particularly women and young people, within the context of the ICPD Programme of Action. In line with the UNFPA Disability Inclusion Strategy (2022-2025) and the UN China Disability Inclusion Human Resources Guidance, UNFPA is committed to ensuring equal access to employment opportunities, and to promoting an inclusive work environment which allows persons with disabilities to enter into employment and to fully develop their careers on an equal basis with others. Against this backdrop, UNFPA China is looking for a dedicated part-time communications professional with disabilities, to support the coordination and development of disability inclusion communications products for ICPD30, and implementation of the UNPRPD project linked to UNFPA mandated areas. The consultant will be required to: Scope of work: Review the current communications and knowledge products of UNFPA • (Description of services, China office for disability inclusion and create communications content that activities, or outputs) would engage persons with disabilities. Assess the accessibility of UNFPA China premises, facilities and services to persons with disabilities and provide advice for improvement in line with the new UN operational and management standards in China.

A summary report on two salons organized with persons with disabilities that demonstrate UNFPA's commitment to disability inclusion, and advocate for sexual and reproductive health and rights for all in English and Chinese languages.
